

The special needs population of Maui County is estimated at greater than 3500. The current employment rate for developmentally disabled adults in Hawaii is 5%. The national average is 23%, and some states, such as Washington, are achieving higher than 50% employment rates. (<http://statedata.info>).



Camphill is an international movement that establishes life-sharing communities to meet the needs of people with developmental disabilities. Inspired by Dr. Rudolf Steiner, the first farm community was founded in Scotland in 1939. Today, this international movement includes 100's of communities around the world.

Working in partnership with The County of Maui, La'a Kea Foundation, inspired by the Camphill movement, wishes to introduce the La'a Kea Community Farm.

## Meeting the Need

The State of Hawaii Department of Health Developmental Disabilities Division has identified vocational training and employment as their top priority for people with developmental disabilities. There is a clear need for viable options and La'a Kea has a site that lends itself to this need.

## Waiver

As a Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) for persons with developmental disabilities Medicaid Waiver provider, La'a Kea Foundation is offering Adult Day Health (ADH), Personal Assistance/Habilitation (PAB) and supportive employment at Sunrise Farm Community. The campus is located on 12 acres of farmland on Baldwin Avenue in Paia, Hawaii.

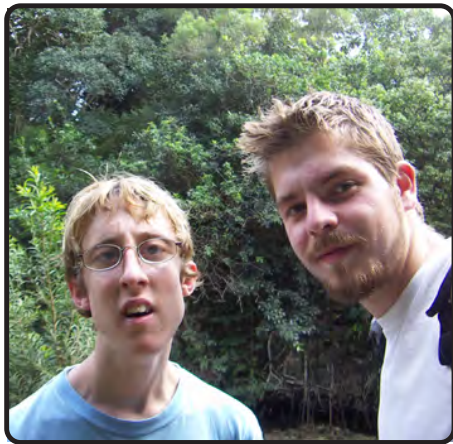


## Help Support The La'a Kea Community Farm
